MID BERGEN REGIONAL HEALTH COMMISSION BOARD MEMBER NEEDED:

THE BERGENFIELD BOARD OF HEALTH MUST SELECT ONE OF ITS MEMBERS TO ENROLL AS A MID BERGEN REGIONAL HEALTH COMMISSION BOARD MEMBER. THE PERSON WILL BE REQUIRED TO ATTEND VIA ZOOM THE QUARTERLY MID BERGEN BOARD MEETINGS. STATUTE 26:3-85. COMPOSITION OF A COMMISSION.

CAUSES OF DEATH IN WALLINGTON:

HEART DISEASE AND CANCER ARE THE LEADING CAUSES OF DEATH IN WALLINGTON. THE MOST PROMINENT CANCERS WERE COLORECTAL AND LUNG CANCER. THERE WERE TWO FENTANYL OVERDOSES; AGES 34 AND 38. FOUR COVID RELATED DEATHS WERE AGED 88, 90, 92, AND 98. TWO SUICIDES; AGES 18 AND 54.

AVERAGE LIFE EXPECTANCY IN WALLINGTON = 74.6 AVERAGE LIFE EXPECTANCY IN NEW JERSEY (2019) = 80.5 AVERAGE LIFE EXPECTANCY IN THE U.S.A. = 77.8
